# BEAVER DAM MIDDLE SCHOOL

As part of the BDUSD Facilities Plan, the District is exploring options for Middle School replacement.

• The current Middle School building is 100 years old with significant facility needs.

• The current Middle School site is significantly undersized and landlocked; it is in a dangerous location immediately adjacent to Business Hwy 151 (Spring Street) and just east of Hwy 33.

#### CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT OPTIONS:

- BASIC CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS:
  - does not address instructional spaces or campus/site challenges
- COMPREHENSIVE RENOVATION:
  - does address instructional spaces, but does not improve the campus/site realities
- NEW MIDDLE SCHOOL:
  - address instructional spaces and campus/site challenge

# WASHINGTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

As part of the BDUSD Facilities Plan, the District is committed to a 3-section elementary school at Washington Elementary School with the addition of Wilson Elementary School students. Washington Elementary School was built in 1949 and is in need of renovation to extend its use for decades to come.
