We are grateful for all those that took the time to provide responses; your feedback is valuable and will be used to make future decisions. Thank you again to those community members who participated.

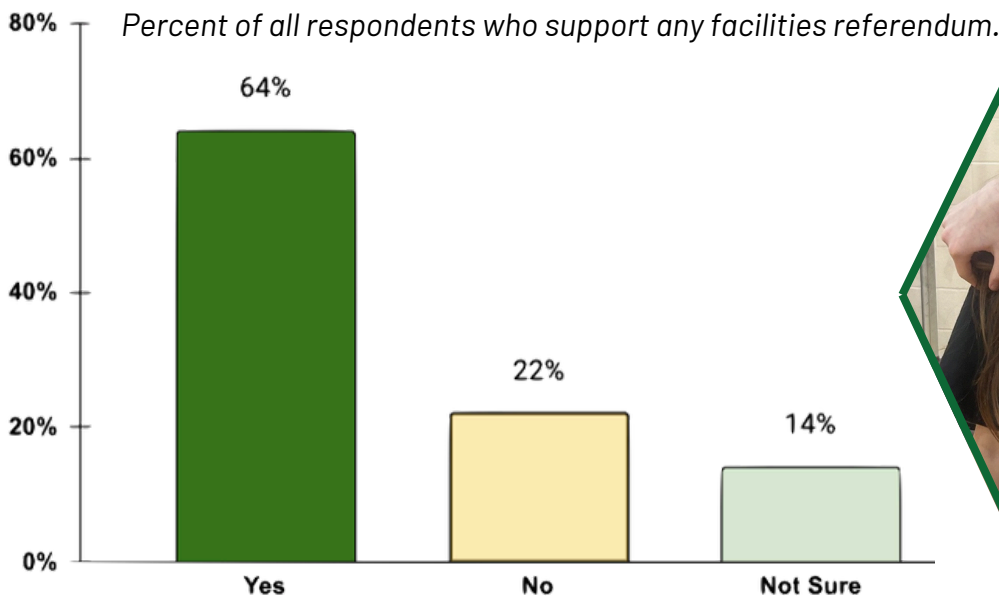

WHY IS A REFERENDUM NEEDED?

MIDDLE SCHOOL (built in 1922)

- Major building systems (plumbing, heating/ventilation, and electrical) have exceeded their service life and need to be replaced.
- Site Safety (the site is too small, has limited green space, congested traffic, and insufficient parking).
- Inadequate classrooms and support areas.

WASHINGTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL (built in 1949)

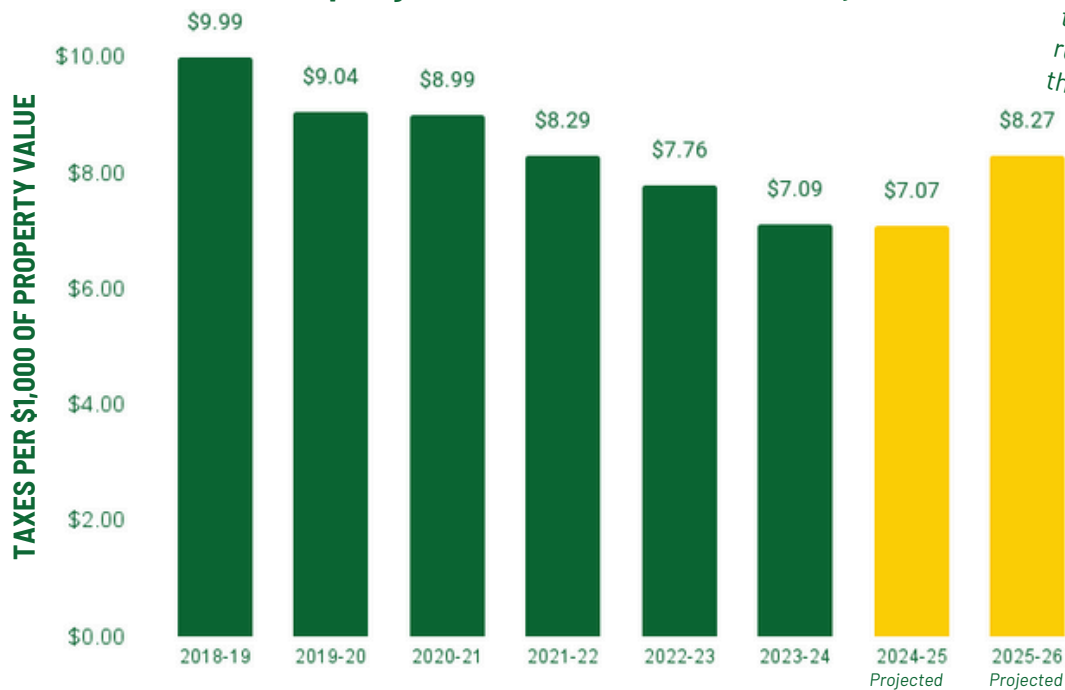
- Update major building systems (fire alarms/sprinklers, heating, plumbing, electrical, etc.).
- Additional classroom space is needed to accommodate Wilson Elementary School students.
- Provide a better instructional environment for students.

DISTRICT-WIDE IMPROVEMENTS

- Playground Improvements
- Drop-off / Pick-up Improvements
- Site Safety (Circulation & Fencing)
- Community Recreation
- ADA Access
