Additional Analysis: Would the \$107 million referendum to fund the recommended plan be supported?



Weighted support for *Definitely yes and Probably yes:* 0.25 (64%) + 0.75 (47%) = <u>51.3%</u>

What did we learn?

- A majority of all subgroups support the District exploring a capital (facilities) referendum.
- While the weighted average analysis has slightly more than 50% support for the \$107 million proposed plan, it is within the margin of error.
- There is enough support to put the proposed plan on the ballot in November and let the voters decide.
